#YouSaid - What matters to you

You said that the following three priorities matter to you. Due to this, we have taken proportionate steps to target harden, educate and tackle the following priorities.

Priority 1) To reduce anti-social behaviour involving young people in Kegworth, specifically in response to a recent spike in incident reports.

Actions Taken) We have now liaised with local schools/ colleges and have established a list of individuals who have been or were likely to be present during times of ASB. Ongoing work to reduce their behaviour is currently being conducted, with education and diversion being key.

Priority 2) To reduce vehicle related crime at hot spot locations across the Valley beat.

Action Taken) Leaflet drops have been conducted around construction sites to remind van drivers to protect their property. Local drop in sessions arranged, CCTV trawls of any possible offences and high visibility patrols maintained.

Priority 3) To engage with hard to reach groups of older adults to reduce their fear of crime and seasonal isolation.

Action Taken) We have engaged with the local elderly communities and have established fears and crime concerns. We have dedicated time to organising meetings / pop In sessions to facilitate specific crime concerns such as fraud. Further opportunities being explored to offer free home security measures to the elderly community.

#WeDid - What we are doing

For much of January, crime figures were good. We have received few reports of anti-social behaviour, minimal thefts and have dedicated time to patrolling key hotspot locations to reduce criminal activity. Towards the latter part of the month, three burglaries have been recorded within Castle Donington, suspicious activity in Kegworth and patrols have continued around Moto-services due to the velocity of lorries being broken into.

Throughout January, the team have also had to cover front desk duties (Coalville front enquiry office, Belvoir Road, Coalville), have responded to emergencies, liaised with partner agencies and have continued to gather intelligence locally to ensure that we can keep up to date with trending activities.

Whilst you might not see us face to face, we are always patrolling, dedicating valuable time to problem solve our chosen priorities.

Meet the beat



With children back to school after the Christmas break, it was time for the little ones to learn about 'who helps us'- it was safe to say that all the children at Diseworth Primary School know exactly who to call in an emergency and what to say to strangers if approached.

We are also pleased to have been invited to other primary schools across the patch, as teaching children at a young age is of utmost importance.

In addition to school visits, we have also participated in an engagement event at the bowls club in Kegworth. The dementia and support café held here is paramount to get people talking, with new friends being found and the occasional tea and biscuit being digested.

Whilst out and about, PC 2238 Simpson and PCSO 6178 Russell also seized the Black Fiat Punto (pictured on the left), this vehicle did not have MOT nor road tax. Safe to say it was taken off the roads without question.
